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Students and Teachers' Evaluation of the Blended

Learning Experience during the Pandemic; The case of

the English Department at Oran2 University

Abstract:

The pandemic situation, which has handicapped the world since 2019, urged many

domains to shift towards the virtual world. Neatly, the teaching-learning environment is

not out of the equation. In Algeria, higher education institutions benefited tremendously

from the facilities of the internet, in the delivery of the courses during the Covid 19's

crisis, and this through the integration of a form of Blended learning. In this, both

students and teachers had to cooperate to save the academic years. Mindful of this, the

present research work endeavours to unravel university students' and teachers'

perceptions and evaluations of this learning experience, through the lens of students and

teachers from the English department of Oran 2 university .100 student and teacher

were invited to respond to an online questionnaire, that was administered to the

informants through a facebook group. Results revealed conflicting views towards the

Blended learning journey. Although this latter proved to be fruitful as a whole, the

integration of this novel learning approach was hindered by a variety of hurdles.
